With a large proportion of Granite students facing food insecurity, hunger can perhaps be the greatest barrier to learning. After all, who could be expected to attend school and to pay attention in class if they haven't even had enough to eat.

Few people are as passionate about service and hunger as Kim Oborn, our Food Assistance Program Coordinator. The idea that there is so much food insecurity right here in our own community is truly disturbing, and Kim has shaped her career for many years in an effort to meet this daunting need.

"I want to make a difference in the lives of the people around me," Kim says. "Several years ago, I volunteered at a food pantry in Colorado before being hired full-time. It opened my eyes to the need that is out there and really contributed to my passion to help feed the hungry. When I moved to Utah, I wanted to continue fighting food insecurity, and I was lucky enough to find this opportunity with a truly outstanding organization—Granite Education Foundation.

With so many students living in poverty, the Foundation works to provide basic clothing, outerwear, school supplies, hygiene kits, and more to help ensure an equitable educational experience. We also provide holiday assistance through our Santa Sacks program each year—so children can proudly return to school after the winter break having experienced the same magic of the holidays as their friends.

Remi Prince oversees the Student Aid program, and with so many elements comprising the breadth of the program, it's a very big job.

"I really care about the nonprofit world, and I love making a difference in this way," Remi says. "I actually grew up in Granite School District, but I was not familiar with the Foundation until after graduating from college. Now that I'm here, I often hear about situations when families are at their lowest, but it's gratifying to know that something as simple as a coat or a new pair of shoes can create real opportunities for change. Those shoes may allow a child to comfortably walk to school and to pay attention in class without worrying that they don't fit in.

FOOD PANTRY MODELS

With a large proportion of Granite students facing food insecurity, Granite Education Foundation strives to provide nutritional assistance to children and families through several distribution models. Working with school administration, Kim Oborn, our Food Assistance Program Coordinator, determines the type of food pantry model best fit for each school that requests one; and oversees their management. Schools are in charge of daily operations, stocking shelves and serving students, while we handle restocking deliveries and help with suppling volunteers for the larger Family Pantries.

SANTA SACKS

Santa Sacks is Granite Education Foundation's holiday assistance program. It's our way of bring some holiday magic to kids who may otherwise go without. Santa Sacks is made up of two programs; Santa Sacks Elementary, which serves grades k-5, and Santa Sacks Secondary, which serves grades 6-12.

Santa Sacks Elementary is run by two amazing ladies, Kathy Newton and Sandy Clayson, who volunteer their time to do so! They've been running the program for years and have it down to an exact science. As soon as Christmas is over, they are already looking to source items for the next year. We truly couldn't do without them, and are so grateful for their efforts.

Santa Sacks Secondary is run by Remi, our Student Aid Program Coordinator. Just as Kathy and Sandy do, Remi starts sourcing items early. With Santa Sacks the work go year round.

The reason for the two separate programs for lower and high grades is that younger and older kids have different needs, and like different things, and we try to cater to that to the best of our ability. A fun toy for the younger kids, some earbuds for the older kids. Along with items like those we also add schools supplies, hygiene items, and a book.

Starting in mid October Santa Sacks for both Elementary and Secondary start getting assembled by volunteers. Last year, just in Secondary Santa Sacks 1700 were assembled and distributed!



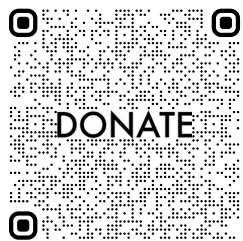
